

By Royal Decree,

Whereas,

It is desirable that we codify the usage of the style and attribute of *Majesty* and the titular dignity of *King* and *Queen*.

Whereas,

It is desirable that the style and attribute of *Majesty* and the titular dignity of *King* and *Queen* be prefixed to the first given name of each person so titled.

Whereas,

It is desirable that, when used as a spoken or written form of address, the style and attribute of *Majesty* take the form of *Your Majesty*, and in plural, *Your Majesties*.

Whereas,

It is desirable that, when used as a third-person reference, the style and attribute of *Majesty* take the gender-specific form of *His* or *Her Majesty*, and in plural, *Their Majesties*.

Whereas,

It is desirable that the Monarch of the Realm forever hold the style and attribute of *Majesty* and the titular dignity of *King* or *Queen*.

Whereas,

It is desirable that the wife of the Monarch of the Realm forever hold the style and attribute of *Majesty* and the titular dignity of *Queen*.

Whereas,

It is desirable that the mother of the Monarch of the Realm forever hold the style and attribute of *Majesty* and the titular dignity of *Queen Mother*.

Whereas,

It is desirable that this Royal Decree be referred to in all legal documents as the *Majestic Titles Decree of 2026*, or otherwise referred to as RD-2026-017.

Whereas,

It is desirable that the Great Seal be affixed to this Royal Decree upon the signature of His Majesty The King.
