With careful consideration of popular and political trends of inactivity inside Melite and also in an effort to culturally de-anglicise, this Charter shall be put in force from the point of publication in the territories of the Democratic Christian Federation of Melite:

T

he President of Melite orders the following:

1. Efforts to give Melite a constitution as a Republic shall *de facto and de jure* stop, and the **Melitian Constitutional Convention is formally dissolved**.
2. The **Parliament of Melite** shall be **indefinitely suspended** as an institution.
3. The words *Democratic Christian Federation* shall **be removed from** the formal name of Melite.
 - a. Melite shall henceforth be referred to as **the State of Melita**.
 - i. The genitive term for Melita shall be the Melitæan State and may be used as an alternative name.
4. All registered political parties, including the ruling parties and alliances, are to be forcefully dissolved.

5. The current President of Melita shall act as an acting regent in preparation for a transition away from a republic.
 - a. The posts of Vice-President and Premier of the former D.C.F. of Melite shall be abolished.
 - b. The post of Supreme Court Judge / Justice shall be preserved together with the entire institution of the Supreme Court.

Therefore, this Charter shall consist of these subsequent provisions:

The State and its Territories

6. The Socialist Fgura Special Administrative Region shall either
 - a. Be granted independence from Melita as a sovereign state
OR
 - b. dissolved in its entirety and its territory re-ceded to the village of Fgura, however not to the Republic of Malta.ⁱ

7. Melita shall cease to function as a federation and shall become a unitary state.

8. The following changes in territory shall be affected:
 - a. Melita is not allowed to contain territory outside of the Maltese archipelago, except for any islands in the proximity of North Africa and Italy excluding Sicily and Sardinia.
 - b. The following former States shall be dissolved:
 - i. Comino
 - ii. Kilna
 - iii. Leoni
 - iv. Saracinia
 1. And reintegrated back into their respective villages, however not to the Republic of Malta.ⁱⁱ
 2. New provinces may not be formed, admitted or annexed from other former states.
 - c. North Zagoria shall be granted Independence and is allowed to join any state it wishes except Melita per 6a.

- d. No change shall occur to the status of the incorporated, unorganised territory of Xaghra, which shall remain subordinated to Dominica Autonomous City.
9. The former states of Melite may also possibly take the following routes in their future:
- i. Join a Monarchy in Personal or Real Union, retaining its distinct features and territory, shedding some.
 - ii. Remain a Catholic Republican state.
 - iii. Dissolve in their entirety.
- b. Only the Acting Regent of the Melitæen Stateⁱⁱⁱ and the Governor of the former state of Mustensis may decide on the fate of their respective city/province.

The Faith

10. The **Latin, Catholic, Apostolic religion**, brought to Malta by Saint Paul, the Apostle of the Gentiles himself in 60 A.D., shall remain established as the state religion of the State of Melita.
- a. Any Catholic rite in communion with the Roman Pontiff remains recognised and protected.
 - i. Both Catholicism and Eastern Orthodoxy shall be protected against non-Christian persecution.
 - b. The authorities of the Church are entrusted to gifting the Holy Sacraments to whom they think is adequately prepared to receive them.
 - c. The clergy of the Church are trusted to instruct the nation on right and wrong.

- i. They are immune from prosecution while acting on their sacred duties, except if gross misdemeanour, moral, and/or financial scandal is alleged and/or proven, where then action is expected to be taken.
- d. The Church and the State shall remain distinct persons in front of the Law.
- e. The State is obliged to aid the Church financially, however, is to respect any attempts by the latter, in any time, to maintain its financial and moral independence.

Symbols of the State

11. Two State Hymns shall be established:
 - a. L-Innu Malti (Maltese Hymn), written by Don Karm Psaila and composed by Robert Samut.
 - b. La Marcha Real/Grenadera (Royal March / March of the Grenadiers) using neither the Marquina nor the Peman lyrics.
12. There shall be two flags representing the State of Melita:
 - a. A rectangular bicolour with a field divided into white on the hoist, and red on the fly and charged in the white canton with a white Maltese eight-pointed cross bordered with black shall be designated the **Ethnic Flag** of Melita.
 - b. The following description shall be considered the **State Flag** of Melita^{iv}:
 - i. Upper Section: A white field with the red cross 'La Religione' of the Knights Hospitaller / Order of Malta.
 - ii. Middle Section:

1. Left: The Cross of Burgundy on a white field, symbolizing the Spanish Empire, with its characteristic red, jagged saltire.
2. Right: Divided per pale, featuring:
 - a. The Kingdom of Aragon: Vertical stripes of red and gold (yellow), iconic of the Crown of Aragon.
 - b. The Kingdom of Sicily: The same red and gold stripes with the addition of a black eagle displayed, on a silver triangle over the stripes.
- iii. A blue field with golden fleurs-de-lis, interspersed with two golden Chouan (Most Sacred) hearts, representing the Capetian House of Anjou and the French counterrevolutionaries.
 1. This design shall also be used as the basis of a Melitæan coat of arms, with the difference that the Chouan (Most Sacred) hearts shall be placed on the Burgundian cross.^v
 - a. Should Melita join a Monarchy the Coat of Arms shall be topped by the respective monarchy's crown.
 2. With regards to the coat of arms, the 'Yoke and Arrows' of the Catholics monarchs are to be included outside of the escutcheon.

Languages and the State

13. The Melitæan State shall recognise the following languages:
 - a. Malti – Maltese

- i. As a national and administrative language. Used for discourse, decrees and legislation.
 - b. British English – Ingliz
 - i. A secondary administrative working language (also frequently used in everyday life) to ease foreign communication.
 - c. Italiano – Taljan – Italian AND Español – Spanjol – Spanish
 - i. Two culturally significant languages considering the strategic location of the Maltese archipelago right under the island of Sicily and the historical proximity between the two islands. Translation of decrees to these languages shall be made available by individual requests as an entitlement.
- 14. Every citizen of Melita has the right to converse in these four languages, however Maltese, Italian and English shall be given precedence.

- 15. Discrimination against citizens unable to speak a language from the above is prohibited, except for jobs that specifically require fluent writing or communication.

The State and Society

- 16. The State shall respect that marriage is inherently a religious sacrament ordained by God.
 - a. It shall be understood and defined as the life-long union between a **single** man and a **single** woman, who with their children, in God's plan form a Family.
 - i. Both Bigamy and Polygamy are prohibited.

- ii. The State recognises that by her life within the home, a woman gives to the State a support without which the common good cannot be achieved.
 - iii. The State shall ensure that fathers^{vi} are not coerced by economic necessity and therefore impeded from forming a fundamental part of the family and that mothers^{vii}, shall not be obliged by economic necessity to engage in labour to the neglect of their duties in the home.
 - b. Despite and in spite of the aforementioned, the State shall not recognise the concept of civil marriage, and furthermore, shall not seek to regulate religious marriage.
 - c. No law from that directly threatens the sanctity of marriage shall be either promulgated or failing to stop the former, enforced.
 - d. No one shall be forcefully married to another individual.
17. Abortion is a morally depraved evil and its practice shall not be tolerated.
- a. No amendment to this Charter may introduce the practice of abortion without abrogating this Charter as a whole.
18. Secret Societies that seek to overthrow the State and/or plan to upheave social, familial, and religious order are prohibited.
- a. This includes but is not limited to all forms and instances of Freemasonry.

Final Provisions

19. This charter shall have a sunset clause of two months from the entering-in-force of this Charter, however not later than the beginning May 2025.
20. All treaties signed by the Ministers of Foreign Affairs, the President, Vice-President and Premier of the former Democratic Christian Federation of Melite are to be considered null save for the following exceptions:
 - a. Governorate of Græcia
 - b. Tsardom of Begonia
 - c. Kingdom of Novus Hierosolymis
21. Melita is to stop its membership in all international treaties and organisations save for the League of Hellenistic Micronations.
