Landopia Treaty of Mutual Recognition

Signed by the Socialist Commonwealth of Aenopia and Kingdom of Landopia

Signed and ratified on 30 September 2025

§1 Copyright Statement

§1 Protocol

For the reference of the contents of this act within both the government and public sectors, the following names and terms may be used:

1. In accordance with the “Statute Books Directive (2025)”, this treaty may be known by its legislative code as described on the government of Aenopia’s registry as “F-M-3009251”.
2. In an international context, the treaty may be known by both participating sovereign states as the “Landopia Treaty of Mutual Recognition”.
 - a. Other permissible names may include the “Landopia Treaty” or the “Aenopia-Landopia Treaty of Mutual Recognition”.
3. Within the content of this legislation, the following terms are recognised and defined as:

The Parties is the aggregate term for the political institutions and ruling bodies involved in the negotiation and maintenance of relations between the participating sovereign states;

Passive Diplomats are representatives of the political institutions and ruling bodies who fulfil their role as representatives as an extension of their leadership duties;

§ 2 Overview

In the pursuit of peace, prosperity and long-term cooperation, the participating sovereign states recognise any historical associations (notably mutual membership to the Grand Unified Micronational) and hereby agree to the establishment of formal relations.

The Landopia Mutual Recognition Treaty is thereby defined as a treaty signed by the nations of the; Socialist Commonwealth of Aenopia, and Kingdom of Landopia. Both nations agree to sign and adhere to the material of the treaty in the pursuit of peace, prosperity and long-term cooperation. When the treaty is signed both nations will adhere to the material listed below.

§ 3 Contents Section I: Diplomacy

1. Communications between diplomats representing the participating sovereign states shall be taking place primarily through diplomatic dialogue channels. The English language shall be the language used to communicate between nations.
 - a. Communications conducted between diplomats in external venues, namely any intermicronational institutions or organisations co-inhabited by the delegates, is considered to be outside of the realm of inter-state affairs.
2. Any form of intermicronational conflicts involving the participating sovereign states shall be dealt with through formal dialogue between diplomats.
 - a. Participating sovereign states are encouraged to resolve any disputes or conflicts through intermicronational institutions when appropriate.
 - b. If not applicable, mediator states or diplomats considered to be devoid of relation to the mutual recognition treaty may be assigned upon the request of a participating sovereign state.
3. Any form of dialogue between two diplomats from both parties shall be kept private unless both parties agree on releasing it.
 - a. Dialogue between diplomats conducted in international venues is considered to be devoid of relation to the mutual recognition treaty and therefore exempt.



§ 4 Contents Section II: Recognition

1. The participant sovereign states of the treaty shall recognize the legitimacy of the territorial claims of their counterparts.
2. The participant sovereign state of the treaty shall recognize the legitimacy and authority of the governments and institutions of their counterparts.
3. The participant sovereign states shall recognize each other's noble and political titles in the nations.
4. The participating sovereign states are encouraged to appoint passive diplomatic representatives as part of the establishment of formal diplomatic channels.
5. The participating sovereign states agree, in principle, to the future pursuit of closer ties with the implementation of successive agreements.
 - a. In recognising this, any future amendments to the treaty of mutual recognition may be enacted with the signing of subsequent agreements.

§6 Contents Section IV: Terms

1. Any pre-existing treaties of mutual recognition involving the participant sovereign states, be it bilateral or multilateral, will be suspended in accordance with the conditions described in the respective legislation;
 - a. In the event of a pre-existing multilateral agreement involving the participant sovereign states, the pre-existing treaty will be superseded in favour of the treaty of mutual recognition signed on this day.
2. Any violation of the Treaty shall result in diplomatic dialogue between the participant sovereign states.
3. Any act of hostility between the participant sovereign states shall suspend the treaty without the invoking of diplomatic dialogue.
 - a. In the event of an act of hostility, the participant sovereign states may elect to invoke diplomatic dialogue post-suspension.
4. In recognising the terms defined in [§ 4, Article 4](#), both participating sovereign states are required to maintain their diplomatic channels as a prerequisite of relations.
 - a. In the event of the cessation of dialogue for a prolonged period of time, a participant sovereign state may elect to suspend relations.
5. A participant sovereign state who wishes to suspend the treaty of mutual recognition must present their diplomatic counterpart with no less than one week notice;
 - a. Diplomatic dialogue may occur in the week in the view of renegotiating or reassessing the relations established by the treaty.
 - b. The participant sovereign state electing to suspend the treaty is obliged to host diplomatic dialogue at the request of their participating counterpart state.
6. Both participant sovereign states agree to convene on the eve of the signing of the treaty to discuss the terms of the treaty.

§ 7 Signatories

The following signatories recognise and authorise the implementation of the content of this mutual recognition treaty, and exercise their powers as the higher authorities of the signatory states to implement this treaty as legally binding legislation from the signing and ratification of this act onwards. The contents of this act will come into force on 1 October 2025.

This act has been formally approved by the Monarchy of the Socialist Commonwealth of Aenopia for signing and ratification by the Head of State of Aenopia on 30 September 2025.

This act has been formally approved by the Monarchy of the Kingdom of Landopia for signing and ratification by the Head of State of Landopia on 30 September 2025.


